BACKGROUND REPORT

Mr. C. Scott Hirons served the citizens of Stafford County for four years as a member of the Planning Commission from January 1, 2010 through December 31, 2013, representing the Falmouth District. Mr. Hirons was elected as Vice Chairman in 2012 and 2013.

Mr. Hirons served on multiple committees while also serving on the Planning Commission. These included the Comprehensive Plan subcommittee, the Parks and Recreation Commission, and on the Architectural Review Board from 2012-2013, as well as many Technical Review Committee meetings that dealt with issues in the Falmouth District.

Notable accomplishments during Mr. Hirons' time on the Planning Commission included securing proffer funds for an artificial turf field at Stafford High School during its rebuild, passing a Farmers Market Ordinance, passing a Microbrewery Ordinance, and working on the Comprehensive Plan rewrite and adoption. Mr. Hirons was a staunch Schools' advocate particularly in regards to developers following through with proffers.
